Retention Data Report	Miranda Chalabi	Miranda Chalabi shared the Mental Health Client Retention Demographics with the group. This report provided the Client Retention Rates defined as the percentage of clients opened during the specified time period who received 3 or more visits within 90 days of opening. If a client was opened to multiple programs (subunits) during the specified time period, the individual will only be counted once in both the denominator and numerator. Clients opened during the time period but have not been open for the entire 90 days will be excluded from both the denominator and numerator if they did not meet the retention criteria (received 3 or more visits). However, they will be included in the retention rate (both denominator and numerator) if they did receive 3 or more visits.
