Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Newsletter: Street Medicine Team	Lise Talbott	Golden Valley Health Center's Street Medicine Team provides acute medical services and access to care to people who are homeless. A Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) and a Community Health Worker (CHW) are connecting with the homeless population by bringing medical services to them with the use of a medical van equipped with medical supplies to perform basic medical services such a wound care, blood pressure checks, and glucose checks. The general scope of the medical team is to provide outreach, triage, mobile medicine, transportation and referrals to GVHC and community partners. Suicide Prevention Needs Assessment	Sharrie Sprouse	September 2015 - Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors expressed concern statewide efforts to reduce suicides had not been effective and identified reducing suicide rates as a funding priority.  April 2016 - the Mental Health Services Act Oversight and Accountability Commission approved the Suicide Prevention Innovation Project.			
		207 Stanislaus County residents have died by suicide. Equates to nearly 1 suicide death every week. The multiple contributing factors of suicide and suicidal behaviors are complex and can be attributed to the interaction of the following root causes:			
		<ul> <li>Mental health stigma and misconception around suicide</li> <li>Decline in connectedness, interpersonal relationships, institutions and other social assets of a society (social capital)</li> <li>Challenges of sharing information across public and private systems, impacting the quality of care</li> <li>Lack of shared best practices or standard practices of care for suicidal behaviors and prevention</li> </ul>
