This curriculum focuses on issues related to Emotional Distress and Well-Being, including: • Common emotional experiences for refugees (i.e., culture shock, homesickness), • An introduction to mental health as it is discussed in the United States, • Ways people can use their community, traditional healing methods and the resources that exist in their community to sustain wellness or seek treatment.
