Denied appeal of approval of Planning Commission decision for PM Application #94-17 and Exception Application #94-05 for Roger and Catherine Towers' (Billie Hammond) request to create three parcels of 3 acres, 3.2 acres and 3.1 acre based on: the staff report which the Board has received and the attachment to the staff report, the testimony that has been presented by the witnesses testifying tonight, the documents that have been received by the Board. The Board has considered staff reports and testimony by staff and testimony by the individuals heard. The Board upholds the Planning Commission action would deny the appeal except to modify condition number 27. A note shall be placed on the final map as follows: individual parcel owners are responsible for extension of irrigation facilities to their parcel subject to OID standards, prior to request for irrigation delivery plans for irrigation facilities shall be approved and impprovement shall be constructed in accordance with these standards. Adoption of conditions set forth in the staff report. The Board further finds that based upon the staff report, the testimony approved the negative declaration based upon the initial study. The Board notes as referred to by several witnesses that Section 15064f states economic and social impacts shall not be treated as significant effects on the environment. Find that the project is "De Minimis" with regard to impacts on fish and wildlife as recommended by the California Department of Fish and Game; find that the required findings set forth in the staff report for an exception can be made for the reasons outlined in the staff report and the testimony of those in favor of denial of appeal; find that none of the findings requiring denial can be made; in addition the Board further finds that no significant effects on the environment based on the evidence presented have been made that the OID proposal recommended changes deal with economic and social impacts which under Section 15064f as was previously mentioned provides that economic or social changes shall not be treated as significant effects on the environment; finds that there were no physical impacts and that there was not sufficient evidence presented of the environmental impacts that would require an EIR; further add that the staff position presented and recommended to the Board is that the issues involving easement and the placement of the notes on the final map under map condition #27 have been sufficient to protect OID and deal with the concerns that have been outlined and raised about the future purchaser of this property 95-273 S-18-WW-20 (1-034
