Supervisor Mayfield asked for clarification regarding Correspondence No. 1 - a letter from CSAC regarding changes in the mitigation planning requirements enacted by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000. The Interim CEO stated that it is regarding disaster preparedness and planning.

Supervisor Grover noted that he and Deputy CEO Richard Jantz were in Sacramento last Wednesday, to attend the Governor and State Controller address to the League of Cities and CSAC.

Chairman Caruso and Supervisor Mayfield attended Senior Awareness Day last weekend and presented commendations to outstanding seniors in the community. The Chairman gave the welcoming remarks at the Native Sons of the Golden West function on Sunday. He spoke regarding the change of time of the Public Comment period at tonight's meeting, and suggested that public hearings be scheduled later in the evening if presentations are on the agenda.

The Interim CEO gave a status update on the State budget situation. She noted that the May Revised Budget was issued on Thursday of last week. She stated that there is some good news in the reports overall, but there is still a lot of one time money and borrowing in this budget plan. The State Budget still needs to be amended and adopted by the State Legislature. She stated that the County budget hearing on 6/15/04 will be for the FY 2004/05 "proposed" budget, and that the "final" budget hearing will be held in September 2004.
