A moment of silence was observed in honor of the memory of Newman City Councilman Alfred "Bush" Rose.

A resolution proclaiming August 2004 as Child Support Awareness Month in Stanislaus County was presented to Tamara Thomas, Assistant Director of Child Support Services.

Henry Dill noted that the State Budget has been signed, and that the IHSS Program has not been cut. He stated that the United Domestic Workers (UDW) employees did their part in contacting their legislators, and now they are waiting for the Board to do their part regarding the labor negotiations.

Naria Jordan read a statement from the UDW regarding the State budget and the In-Home Supportive Services Program.

Dave Thomas spoke regarding his public record request concerning the Board of Supervisors' compensation and expenses. He thanked the Interim CEO and the Clerk of the Board for supplying the requested information.

June Kidd spoke in support of increased wages and medical benefits for IHSS employees.

Grover/Mayfield unan. **9:25am** Finds that notice of the public hearing was published in compliance with §6066 of the Government Code; conducted a public hearing to receive comments regarding the 2004/05 annual assessments; set the 2004/05 annual assessments as shown on Exhibits "A" through "U" for the following County Service Areas and Landscape and Lighting Districts: CSA No. 4-Bristol Glen, CSA No. 5-Starlite Place, CSA No. 6-Raymond Tract, CSA No. 7-Modesto Auto Center, CSA No. 8-Honey Bee Estates, CSA No. 9-River/Souza, CSA No. 11-Gilbert Road, CSA No. 12-Peach Blossom Estates, CSA No. 13-La Jolla, CSA No. 14-United Pallet, CSA No. 15-Patterson Gateway, CSA No. 16-Olive Ranch Estates, CSA No. 17-Sunray Estates, CSA No. 18-Atlas Park, CSA No. 19-Tuolumne-Gratton, CSA No. 20-Summit, Riverdale Landscape and Lighting District, Riverview Landscape and Lighting District, Shackelford Landscape and Lighting District, Howard-McCracken Landscape and Lighting District,

A legislative update was given by Don Peterson, Stanislaus County's Legislative Advocate. He spoke regarding AB 824 (Matthews) a proposal to provide more State funding for the IHSS Program in Stanislaus County and three other counties. He noted that the legislature failed to provide the County the full funding for the cost of the Peterson trial, and he recommended that a letter be sent to State legislators and the Governor regarding this issue. He also noted that SCA 4 (Torlakson) has passed the legislature, and updated the Board regarding its potential negative impact to the County's vehicle license fees (VLF), local property taxes, and sales tax. He recommend that a letter be sent to the State legislators to remedy the negative property tax bail out, and he has drafted an Amendment to address this issue. Both Proposition 65 and SCA 4 will be on the ballot in November 2004, and the Governor has indicated that he will oppose Prop 65 and support SCA 4.

Paul/Simon unan. **B6** Authorized the Auditor-Controller to advance funds to Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District for operational expenses through 8/24/04, under Government Code §23010, not to exceed \$500,000; directed the Auditor-Controller to continue to work with staff from the Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District to identify their funding needs; and, authorized County staff to review all available options to provide fire protection services in the event the District does not continue to be financially viable – Auditor-Controller DF-20-A-1 2004-596

Supervisor Simon requested information regarding the request for use of Public Defender funds for the Peterson Trial. County Counsel explained that the exact request for funds is unknown, but usually the funds are used for expert testimony, copying of photos and other uses, but not attorney expenses. Nevertheless, it is a confidential decision made by the court, and the requests will not be known until after the trial is over. It is already public knowledge that the County's cost is approaching \$1 million at this time.

Supervisor Mayfield stopped by Animal Services to adopt a dog and noted that only 28 of the 60 adopt-apet cages were occupied. He wanted to know why the adoption center is not full. The Interim CEO noted that the State has laws on the adoption process. The Chairman requested information on the various pet adoption agencies. The Interim CEO announced that there will be a town hall meeting regarding the West Nile Virus on Wednesday, 8/11/04 from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. at the Harvest Hall on Cornucopia Way, Modesto.
