Chairman Paul Caruso and Vice-Chair Pat Paul were recognized upon their retirement from the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors.

Lester Williams raised concerns regarding the environmental impact fee on houses that are moved from one location to another.

Noel Barfield also spoke regarding the environmental impact fee that is charged for houses that are moved. County Counsel responded that he would meet with both Mr. Barfield and Mr. Williams to address this issue.

Mary Whetstone, President of the Animal Services Auxiliary, spoke regarding the existing Spay and Neuter Program in the County. She suggested that the Neuter Scooter be used in target neighborhoods on the weekends in an effort to address pet overpopulation.

Warren Brumley thanked Supervisor Pat Paul for her many years of service and support of the Empire community. He thanked the Board for the new Empire Community Park. He also noted that he does not support the increased assessments for the Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District.

Frank Johnson, President of the MJC Student Association, thanked the Board for its support of Measure E.

Linda Cabralee, representing the MJC Spirit Team, thanked the Board for their support of Measure E. She encouraged the community to attend the MJC Mens and Womens basketball games.

Monitoring Plan pursuant to CEQA Guidelines §15074(d); ordered the filing of a Notice of Determination with the Stanislaus County Clerk-Recorder's Office pursuant to Public Resources Code §21152 and CEQA Guidelines §15075; finds that: (a) the General Plan Amendment will maintain a logical land use pattern without detriment to existing and planned land uses, (b) the County and other affected governmental agencies will be able to maintain levels of service consistent with the ability of the governmental agencies to provide a reasonable level of service, (c) the amendment is consistent with the General Plan goals and policies, (d) the proposed Planned Development zoning is consistent with the Planned Development General Plan designation and, (e) the project will increase activities in and around the project area, and increase demands for roads and services, thereby requiring dedication and improvements; approved GPA #2004-02, and Rezone Application #2004-07 - Jacob Auto Sales, subject to the attached amended Development Standards and Mitigation Monitoring Plan; and, introduced, waived the reading, and adopted Ordinance C.S. 911 for the approved Rezone Application #2004-07 - Planning

Paul/Simon (3-2)(Mayfield and Grover opposed) **6:50pm** Granted the appeal of Planning Commission's decision of denial for Parcel Map Application #2004-15, Variance #2004-01, and Exception #2004-03 -Gary & Deann Autrey, a request to create parcels of 1.08, 1.51, 1.11, and 1.10 acres in the A-2-40 (General Agriculture) zoning district on property located at 4336 Adams Gravel Plant Road, northeast of the City of Riverbank, with a variance included for parcels smaller than the 40-acre minimum and an exception for 2 parcels that would not have direct frontage on a County Road; finds the project to be De Minimis for the purposes of collection of Fish and Game Fees pursuant to California Code of Regulations §753.5, by adopting the findings of fact contained in the attached Certificate of Fee Exemption, those findings being based on the analyses presented in the Initial Study, and ordered the filing of the Certificate of Fee Exemption with the Stanislaus County Clerk-Recorder's Office; adopted the Negative Declaration pursuant to CEQA Guidelines \$15074(b), by finding that on the basis of the whole record, including the Initial Study and any comments received, that there is no substantial evidence the project will have a significant effect on the environment and that the Negative Declaration reflects Stanislaus County's independent judgment and analysis; ordered the filing of a Notice of Determination with the Stanislaus County Clerk-Recorder's Office pursuant to Public Resources Code §21152 and CEQA Guidelines \$15075; finds that, based on the record, all three of the variance findings can be made, and that the following parcel map findings can be made: (a) the proposed map is consistent with applicable general and specific plans as specified in §65451; (b) the design or improvement of the proposed subdivision is consistent with applicable general and specific plans; (c) the site is physically suitable for the type of development; (d) the site is physically suitable for the proposed density of development; (e) the design of the subdivision or the proposed improvements are not likely to cause substantial environmental damage or substantially and avoidably injure fish or wildlife or their habitat; (f) the design of the subdivision or type of improvements is not likely to cause serious public health problems; and, (g) the design of the subdivision or the type of improvements will not conflict with easements, acquired by the public at large, for access through or use of, property within the proposed subdivision; in this connection, the governing body may approve a map if it finds that alternate easements, for access or for use, will be provided, and that these will be substantially equivalent to ones previously acquired by the public; and, approved Tentative Parcel Map #2004-15, Variance #2004-01, and specifically approved Exception #2004-03 to allow private access to parcels "C" and "D" and made the findings as set forth on page 4 of the Planning Commission staff report citing unique circumstances and not granting special privilege – Planning
