- *C3 Adopted the results of the Assessment Ballot Procedure (Supporting votes: 118; Protest votes: 56; and Incomplete Ballots: 5) that proposed the addition of alley lighting to the Airport Neighborhood Lighting District; declared that a simple majority of the assessment ballots received supported the proposed addition of alley lighting to the Airport Neighborhood Lighting District; directed the Public Works Department to proceed with the installation of alley lighting within the Airport Neighborhood Lighting District; approved the amount of the annual assessment and finds it necessary to adequately cover expenditures and ensure sufficient revenues for continued operations and maintenance of the District; set the FY 2011-2012 annual assessments at \$45.89 per parcel; the parcels subject to the annual assessment are listed in Attachment "A" of the agenda item; and, authorized the Auditor-Controller to add the annual assessment to the 2011-2012 Tax Roll PW

Supervisor O'Brien reported that on 04/11/2011 the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District will start selling electric lawn mowers at a discounted rate if you turn in a gas powered lawn mower. He also reported that on 04/16/2011 they are offering free vehicle smog checks at MJC. This smog check is not for DMV renewal, but for those vehicles that you know will not pass a smog check. They will test your car and give you up to \$500 in repairs for free. For more information and details go to valleyair.org.

The CEO reported that the main budget bill, trailer bills, cuts bills, and raids on Proposition 63 and Proposition 10 passed both houses of the State Legislature last week and are on their way to the Governor. He noted that the legislation to end redevelopment was defeated in the Assembly by a single vote. The Senate did not take the redevelopment legislation up, but it is anticipated that it will come before both the Senate and the Assembly this next week. It is expected that next week the State Legislature will tackle the Constitutional amendment, tax extensions, a special election, and redevelopment. Committee hearings will also be ramping up and include AB191, the Stanislaus County Negative Bailout Bill.
