Supervisor De Martini noted that the Westside Health Care Task Force will begin their Biggest Loser contest on 08/23/12 at the Newman West Side Theater. There will be a speaker and a luncheon at no cost.

The CEO reported that the legislature began a one month recess starting on July 6th and is scheduled to return on August 6th. Many legislators are in full campaign mode during this recess. Before recess, there was a lot of activity. The legislature approved moving the water bond from November 2012 ballot to 2014. This is the second time the bond has been moved after initially being approved on the 2010 ballot and there are serious discussions about trimming the bill before the 2014 ballot measure. Lawmakers in 2009 said the bond was for a crucial upgrade of California's water infrastructure and would include \$3 billion for new storage projects (which could be above or below ground reservoirs. The Senate and Assembly approved \$8 billion of initial funding for the \$68 billion high-speed rail project after vigorous debate. Pension reform legislation did not happen prior to the recess. There was a lot of discussion about a new tier and putting some curbs on exempt employee retirement benefits. Also, it appears there would be significant changes to "airtime." Airtime is the ability for State workers to "buy" years of work credit,

instead of actually having to work those years and receive the credit toward pension calculations. SB 1517 (Wolk), is regarding the extension of Design-Build authority. The existing law is until 07/01/2014, we are asking authorization for counties to use these alternative procedures, known as design-build, for bidding on specified types of construction projects in the county in excess of \$2.5 million dollars. SB 1517 would extend the sunset date to 07/01/2018. Both Federal chambers are in session this week.
