Betsy Reifsnider, representing Stand for Clean Air in the San Joaquin Valley, spoke regarding emergency air alerts (public health warnings) and reviewed statistics regarding air pollution and associated health risks in our valley.

John Mataka, President of Grayson Neighborhood Council, also spoke regarding air pollution in the valley. He requested that the Board of Supervisors ask the San Joaquin Air Pollution Control Board to start the emergency air alerts earlier.

Maricela Mars-Alatorre, representing People for Clean Air and the Stand for Clean Air Coalition, spoke regarding the health risks of polluted air. She also requested that the emergency air alerts be given earlier.

Chairman O'Brien noted that he is currently the Chairman of the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District. He reported that the Air District now has more readily available information from the Real-Time Air Advisory Network (RAAN) and can provide hourly air pollution level updates. The Air District is working on keeping the public better informed, and is issuing a press release today regarding a new iPhone application.
