Chairman Withrow noted that Frank Clark was in the audience, and thanked him for his willingness to serve on the Water Advisory Committee.

CEO Risen reported that Senator De Leon is getting ready to release his energy proposal which would require the reduction of petroleum use by cars and light duty trucks by 50% by 2030, increase the Renewable Portfolio Standard to 50% by 2030, and increase energy efficiency in buildings to reduce electricity use by 50%. He also reported that Assembly Speaker Atkins released her roads funding proposal which would generate approximately \$1.8 billion gross and includes an additional charge on vehicles. These are significant legislation proposals that the County is keeping an eye on.

Prior to adjourning into Closed Session an opportunity was given to the public to address matters listed under Closed Session.
