Sheriff Christianson noted that May 15th is National Peace Officers' Memorial Day, and he spoke regarding the importance of law enforcement in our community. He attended the California Peace Officers' Memorial Ceremony yesterday in Sacramento, which honored 13 peace officers that lost their lives in 2014. There will be a Stanislaus Peace Officers' Memorial Ceremony tomorrow, 5/6/2015, at 10:00 a.m. at Lakewood Memorial Park in Hughson. Chairman Withrow reported that he, along with Supervisor Chiesa, CEO Risen, and David Jones, Director of Communication and Legislative Affairs, traveled to Washington D.C. last week to meet with our federal representatives. He noted the meetings went very well and that the North Valley Regional Recycled Water Project was well received. He is hopeful that we will be able to secure funding to move this project forward.

Supervisor Chiesa noted the importance of going to Washington D.C. and advocating for Stanislaus County for federal funding. He reported it was a successful trip.

CEO Risen reported that there was a letter in the Modesto Bee with concerns about the time frame to obtain a permit for residential solar panels. The County Building Official conducted an investigation and found that the person who wrote the letter never filed for a solar permit, and the current solar permit turnaround time is approximately 6 weeks, not the 6 months stated in the letter to the Editor. The County will look at ways to improve that time frame, and has reached out to the solar contractor. The CEO noted that the Planning's Building Permits Division continues to be responsive and committed to providing services in a timely manner.

Prior to adjourning into Closed Session an opportunity was given to the public to address matters listed under Closed Session.
