Public Health Officer Dr. Vaishampayan, Director of the Health Services Agency Mary Ann Lilly-Tengowski, Assistant Director of Emergency Services Richard Murdock, Sheriff Dirkse, Deputy Executive Officer Tina Rocha and CEO Hayes provided an update related to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) emergency and essential services in Stanislaus County.

Chairman Chiesa acknowledged receipt of written public comments.

Katherine Borges spoke regarding the need for permanent Spanish/English COVID-19 signs in Salida. She shared information she has learned regarding COVID-19.

Leah Hassett voiced concerns regarding essential workers in Stanislaus County and the need for replacement funds for those who are unable to work due to COVID-19. She also requested additional information be posted on the Health Services Agency website regarding recommendations for the public.

David Leamon, Director of Public Works, presented an update on Public Works projects in Stanislaus County.
