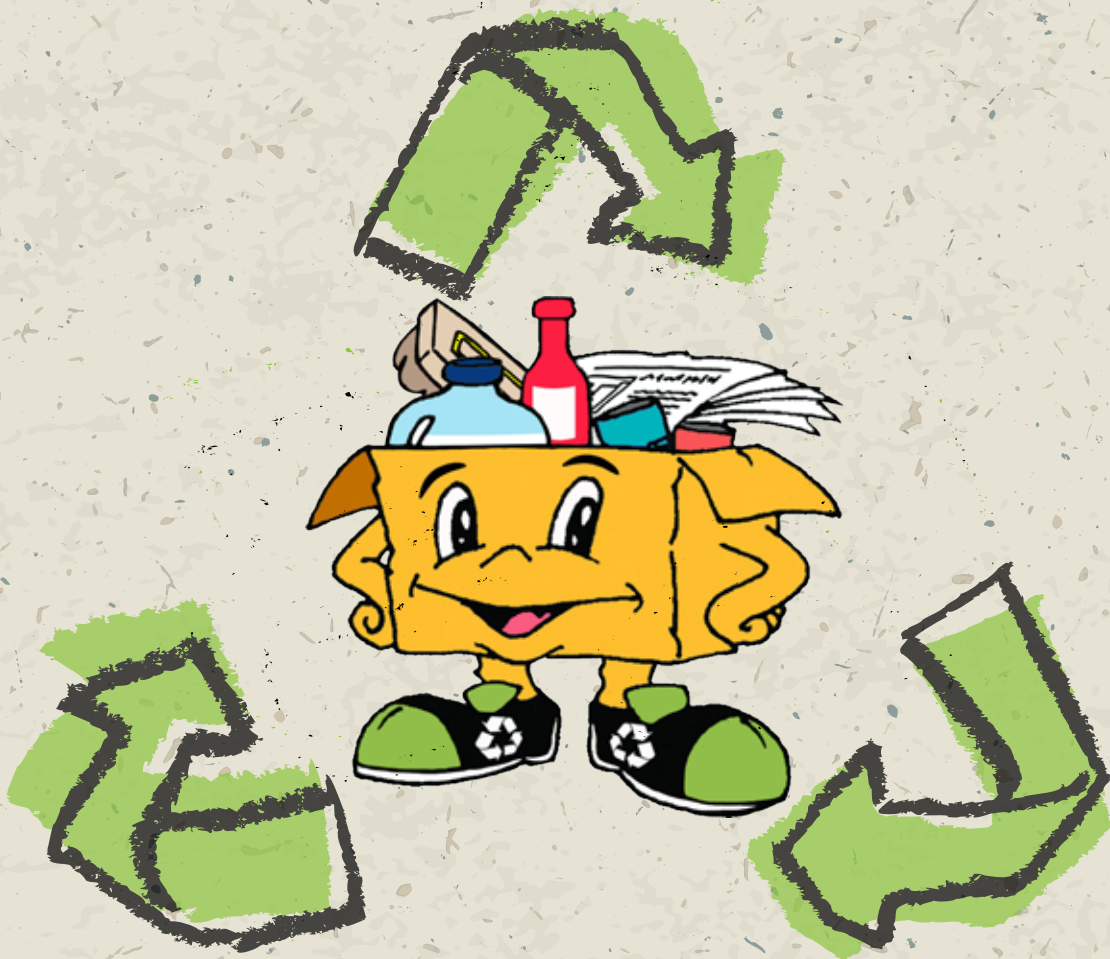
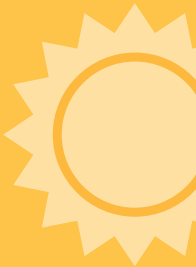

15 gallon (125 lbs) waste limit per car, per day
No containers larger than 5 gallons.

Disposal is **FREE** for all Stanislaus County residents. No out-of-county waste accepted.

Small businesses may be eligible to dispose of waste at the facility upon approval. Call 209-525-6700 to find out if your business qualifies. Fees apply and drop-offs accepted by appointment only.

The HHW facility hosts temporary collection events throughout the county year-round. Check the website for the temporary event schedule of dates and locations.

No e-waste or light bulbs accepted at temporary events.



Reuse is the second step in the waste management hierarchy of "reduce, reuse, recycle." Reusing materials saves money, energy, and natural resources. Call 209-525-6700 for details on our reuse giveaway program.



California State law prohibits disposal of Universal Waste into landfills, such as batteries, electronics, fluorescent lights, thermometers, and thermostats. Stanislaus County residents can drop-off thermometers, thermostats and any other items containing mercury for **FREE** at the household hazardous waste collection facility.



Don't forget to remove batteries from devices before recycling!

BE SAFE WITH YOUR WASTE:

- Label all materials
- Do not mix materials
- Keep all waste in original containers with lids on tight
- If a container is leaking, place it in a sturdy plastic bag or bucket and label it
- Transport waste in the trunk of your car or rear of your truck
- Don't leave your vehicle with waste sitting in the sun or leave it overnight

RETHINK

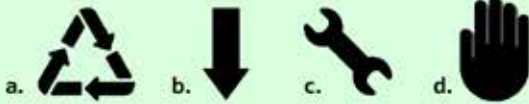


Is purchasing this item a necessity?

BULKY ITEMS

RESIDENTIAL BULKY ITEM COLLECTION PROGRAM

Available to all residents in the unincorporated area of Stanislaus County who are subscribing to garbage service. Qualifying residents can have bulky items picked up at their homes **two times a year!**

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

Large Appliances (doors removed from refrigerators & freezers), Water Heaters, Water Softeners, Toilets, Sinks, Tubs, Mattresses, Box Springs, Couches, Chairs, Tables, Desks, Dressers, Exercise Equipment, Bicycles, Patio Furniture, BBQs (remove propane tanks), Lawn Mowers (gas & oil removed), Air Conditioners, Carpets, Rugs, Doors, Ladders.



DONATION LOCATIONS

Goodwill, Habitat for Humanity ReStore, Hope Chest Thrift Store, Salvation Army and Donation Drop Spots accept all or some of the following: Auto parts, Bikes, Books, Building materials, Car batteries, Cars, CDs, Clothing, Construction & Demolition materials, Dishes, DVDs, Electronics, Eyeglasses, Furniture, Household appliances, Mattresses and Box springs, Paint, Power tools, Sports equipment, Toys, Trophies, and Vacuums.

CRV

Redeem your CRV bottles and cans for \$

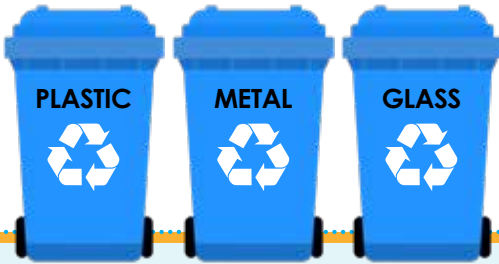
California Redemption Value (CRV) is the amount paid by consumers at the checkout stand and paid back to consumers when they recycle eligible aluminum, plastic, glass and bi-metal beverage containers at certified recycling centers. Items must be separated by material type.



The minimum refund value established for each type of eligible beverage container is 5 cents for each container under 24 ounces and 10 cents for each container 24 ounces or greater.

Recycling centers are allowed to pay by weight as a matter of business efficiency, but consumers also have the option of being paid on a per-container basis if they bring in 50 or fewer CRV containers of each material type. Recycling centers are required to comply with this request. **No out-of-state material is eligible for California Redemption Value.** Consumers and others may only claim CRV for aluminum, glass and plastic beverage containers that were sold in California.

Requirements regarding the condition of beverage containers are established by the recycling center and may vary. Contact your recycling center to determine its requirements.

Which beverage containers can you redeem for CRV?

Eligible for CRV:

- 100% fruit juice less than 46 oz.
- Beer and malt beverages
- Carbonated fruit drinks, water or soft drinks
- Coffee and tea beverages
- Noncarbonated fruit drinks, water or soft drinks
- Sports drinks
- Vegetable juice 16 oz. or less
- Wine coolers and distilled spirit coolers

NOT eligible for CRV:

- 100% fruit juice 46 oz. or more
- 100% vegetable juice more than 16 oz.
- Food and other non-beverage containers
- Infant formula
- Medical food
- Milk jugs
- Spirits
- Wine

When in doubt, check the label on the container:

- CA Cash Refund
- CA CRV
- CA Redemption Value
- California Cash Refund
- California Redemption Value





We'll take your old paint!



Californians generate millions of gallons of leftover paint each year. Prior to the passage of the California Paint Stewardship Law, AB 1343, the only way for residents to properly manage their leftover paint was through taxpayer-funded household hazardous waste (HHW) programs. Historically, paint has represented almost one-third of the material collected through local HHW programs and costs local governments millions of dollars to manage.

The paint take-back program is designated and managed by PaintCare Inc., a nonprofit organization created by paint manufacturers to fulfill their responsibilities under paint stewardship laws. Beginning in October 2012, PaintCare has set up 791 drop-off sites throughout the state where the public can take unwanted paint for recycling. Most are paint retailers (paint, hardware, and home improvement stores) that volunteer to take back paint. They are available to households, businesses, government agencies, and others with leftover paint in California, and accept paint whenever they are open for business. Most locations have a 5 gallon limit. Please call your closest collection site for details before you drop-off.



WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR BUSINESS & MULTI-FAMILY RECYCLING ?



Requirements for Businesses:

- State law requires all businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of waste weekly to recycle.

How To Get Started:

- It's easy to recycle at your business. Make sure your business has arranged for recycling services.
- Separate recyclable items from trash inside your business.
- Place your recyclable items in external recycling containers for collection.
- **Note:** any business or individual may donate, sell and/or otherwise arrange for pickup of recyclable materials.

Requirements for Multi-Family Complexes:

- State law requires that all multi-family complexes with 5 or more units to recycle.

How To Get Started:

- Make sure residents separate recyclable items from trash inside their home.
- Tell residents they must place recyclable items in outside recycling containers for collection.
- Make sure residents know where outside recycling containers are located.
- **Note:** any business or individual may donate, sell and/or otherwise arrange for pickup of recyclable materials.

Whether your business is large or small, expanding, looking for the right location or just an idea, locating in Stanislaus County can make you eligible for valuable incentives. Incentives that can help increase your bottom line. The Stanislaus County RMDZ is a joint commitment by Stanislaus County and the cities within the County to encourage economic and recycling development in a business-friendly climate.

What is the Recycling Market Development Zone (RMDZ)?

A program administered by local governmental agencies under the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) that provides low interest loans and technical assistance to firms that use recycled materials to make new products, or that prevent or reduce waste as part of the manufacturing process.

Who is eligible?

Businesses and nonprofit organizations located in the Stanislaus County Regional RMDZ

What financial assistance is available?

Low interest loans to eligible businesses that:

- Manufacture a new product by using secondary (post consumer or post industrial) waste materials.
- Achieve a net reduction in the waste generated from the manufacturing of a product.
- Add value to a finished product for reuse by reconditioning, reprocessing, repairing, washing, or remanufacturing.

The purpose of the RMDZ program is to assist businesses in finding innovative ways to cost effectively produce less waste and more product for greater profits.

It's a win-win for everyone - businesses grow, the waste stream being sent to landfills diminishes, and the environment is protected.

Mandatory Organics Recycling



New organic recycling requirements will be phased in over several years and will help the state meet its goal to recycle 75 percent of its waste by 2020.

What is Organic Waste?

Organic waste includes food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, non-hazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste.

Businesses, including public entities, and multi-family complexes of 5 units or more are required to recycle their organic waste on and after **JANUARY 1, 2019** that meet **4 cubic yards of commercial solid waste** per week.

"Businesses" includes multi-family complexes with 5 units or more, however, multi-family premises are only required to recycle landscaping waste.



Businesses can meet the mandatory organics recycling requirements through any of the following:

- Source separate organic waste from other waste and subscribe to a basic level of organic waste recycling service that includes collection and recycling of organic waste.
- Recycle your organic waste on-site or self-haul the organic waste for recycling.
- Subscribe to an organic waste recycling service that may include mixed waste processing that specifically recycles organic waste.
- Make other arrangements consistent with the existing right to sell or donate the recyclable organic waste material.

COMPOSTING ORGANICS



What is composting?

Composting is a natural process by which organic materials decompose. Making compost is a controlled or managed version of the natural process. By concentrating the activity in one place and balancing food, air, and water, compost happens faster.

What is compost?

Compost is the soil amendment product that results from proper composting. The end product of the compost process is a soil- or humus-like material that will increase the health of soil.

How does compost benefit the soil?

Compost is like a multivitamin for your soil. It will aid in erosion control, promote soil fertility, and stimulate healthy root development. Compost improves soil structure by adding organic content and also increases the water-holding capacity of soil so that you will not need to water as much. Additionally, compost helps keep heavy-clay-content soil from compacting, meaning that the soil is easier to work and root systems will develop better. It also gives sandy soil needed structure.

Is composting recycling?

Yes. Just like plastic beverage containers or aluminum cans, yard clippings and fruit and vegetable scraps are a valuable resource that can be recycled. Organic materials can be recycled into a soil amendment that will improve and maintain the health of your soil.

How long does it take to produce compost?

Composting happens, but your level of labor dictates how quickly. Generally, it should take from three to six months to make a single batch of compost, depending upon the blend of materials, how often the pile is turned, and the moisture content.

Why should I compost?

Backyard composting allows you to recycle your yard clippings and fruit and vegetable scraps into a valuable soil amendment right in your own yard. It is a great way to save money, reduce the amount of waste that is disposed or processed, and improve the quality of your urban environment.

How Do I Compost?

Just Add Water and Stir!

Composting is a very basic process. You can simply put yard clippings and vegetable scraps into a pile and let nature do the rest in its own time. Compost will happen; yet it will happen very slowly. You can help it along by providing a balanced diet and an enriched environment for the organisms that do the work of composting. For specific instructions go to www.stanislausrecycles.org.

WATERING THE PILE: Moisture content of 40% is the desired moisture level. Begin adding water when you begin to build your pile. Water should be distributed evenly throughout the pile.

AIR: Turn the pile once a month. The decomposer organisms still need air to survive.

COMPOST BINS

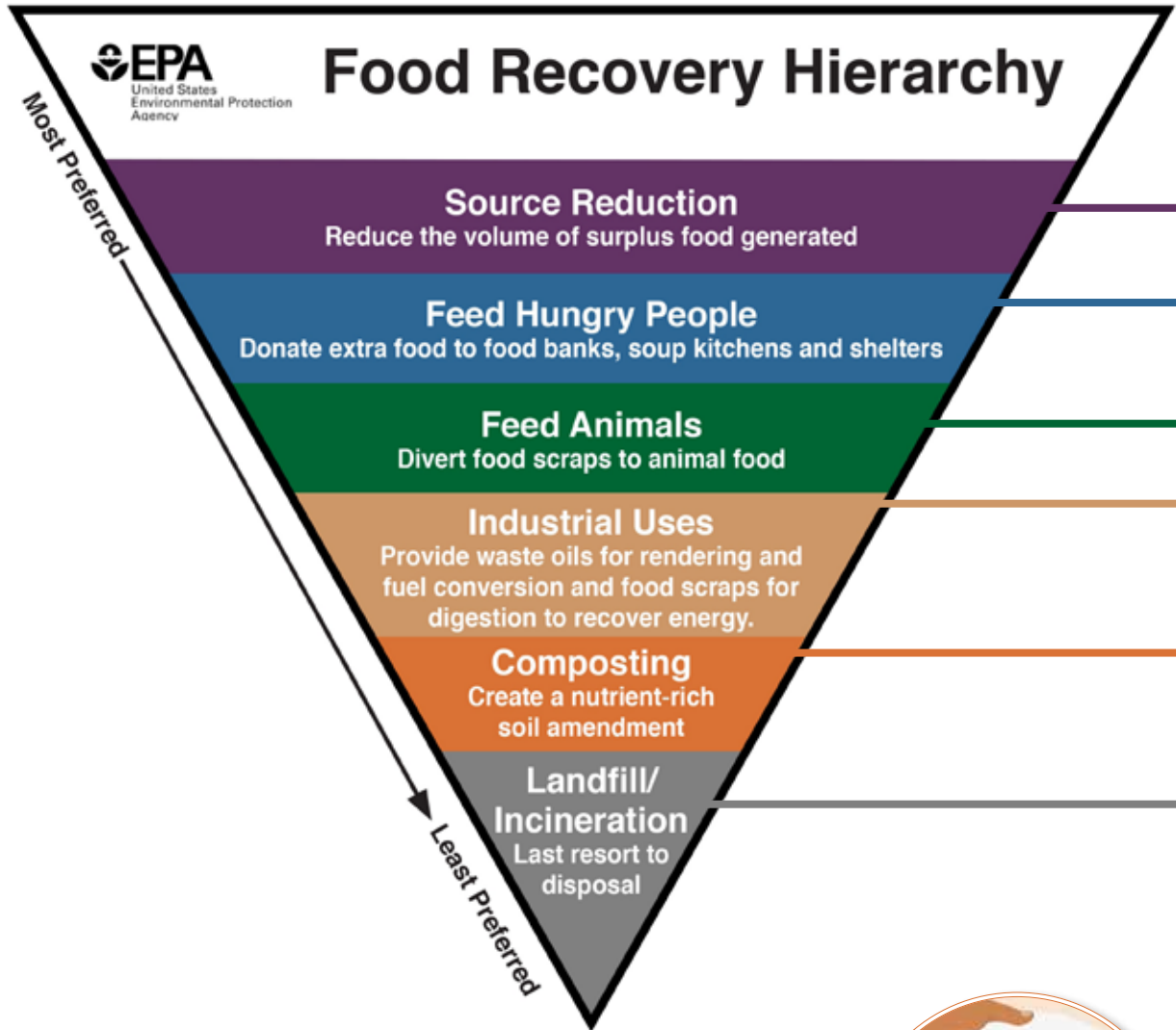
Compost bins are available from a variety of sources. Bins can be purchased from various local businesses and off the internet. The type of structure or method you choose to make compost is really a matter of personal preference. If you are the do-it-yourself type, you may want to build your own structure using materials such as wood, welded wire, concrete blocks or wooden pallets. Prefabricated, ready-built bins, drum turning units, and kitchen pails are also available. Many manufactured bins are made from recycled plastic. If attractiveness of the bin is important, you may want to purchase a manufactured bin.



As a rule of thumb, avoid any substance or material that could be harmful to you or to the decomposer organisms. Always avoid wood and other yard waste materials treated with chemicals. If you are unsure of an item, it is always better to err on the side of safety and not add it.



WASTED FOOD MANAGEMENT



EDIBLE FOOD RECOVERY

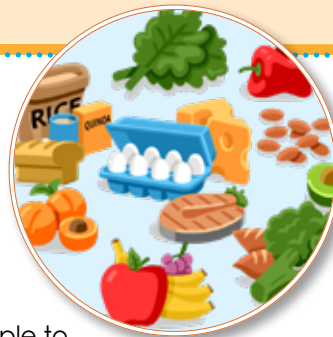
- Food waste alone is the largest waste stream in California.
 - According to CalRecycle's 2014 waste characterization study, food waste comprised 18 percent of our waste stream.
 - California throws away approximately 5.6 Million tons of food waste every year!
-
- SB 1383 requires the state to reduce organic waste [food waste, green waste, paper products, etc.] disposal by 75% by 2025. In other words, the state must reduce organic waste disposal by 20 million tons by 2025!
 - The law also requires the state to increase edible food recovery by 20 percent by 2025.
-
- In California, Millions can be considered Food Insecure
 - It is estimated that 1 in 8 Californians and 1 in 5 children go hungry every night in California – redirecting perfectly edible food that is currently being disposed to feed those in need can help alleviate this.



FOOD RECOVERY HIERARCHY

The Food Recovery Hierarchy prioritizes actions organizations can take to prevent and divert wasted food. Each tier of the Food Recovery Hierarchy focuses on different management strategies for your wasted food.

The top levels of the hierarchy are the best ways to prevent and divert wasted food because they create the most benefits for the environment, society and the economy.



- Source Reduction:** Everyone creates wasted food, but it is just as simple to not create it. Both businesses and individuals can learn to prevent the flow of wasted food by taking simple steps such as making grocery lists, taking inventory, and buying less.
- Feed Hungry People:** In 2017, almost 41 million tons of food were generated in the United States. While Americans dispose of millions of tons of food, the U.S. Department of Agriculture estimates that 11.8 percent of American households (15 million households) had difficulty providing enough food for all their members due to a lack of resources at some time during 2017.
- Feed Animals:** Farmers have been doing this for centuries. With proper and safe handling, anyone can donate food scraps to animals.
- Industrial Use:** Food can be used to not only feed people and animals, but also power your car or generator. There is increasing interest in finding effective means to obtain biofuel and bio-products from wasted food. Anaerobic digestion is a process where microorganisms break down organic materials, such as food scraps, manure, and sewage sludge. Recycling wasted food through anaerobic digestion produces biogas and a soil amendment, two valuable products
- Composting:** Like yard waste, food waste scraps can also be composted. Composting these wastes creates a product that can be used to help improve soils, grow the next generation of crops, and improve water quality. Nationally, the composting of food rose from 1.84 million tons in 2013 (5.0 percent of food) to 2.6 million tons (6.3 percent of food) in 2017. In 2017, Americans recovered almost 27 million tons through composting. (see page 23)
- Landfill:** 30.6 million tons of food waste went to landfills, representing 22 percent of all municipal solid waste landfilled.

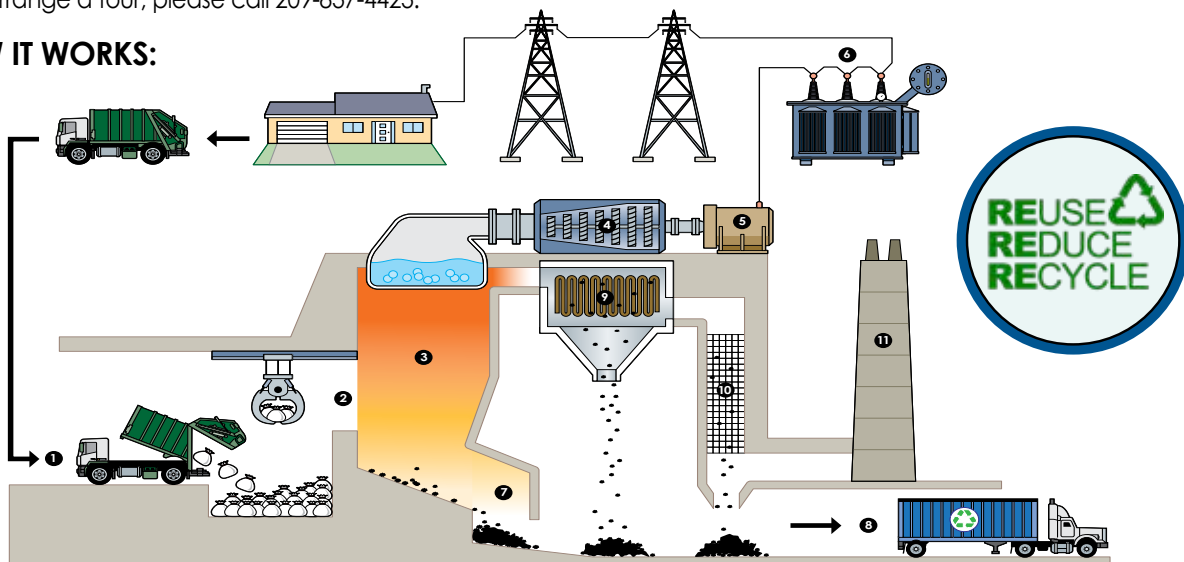
COVANTA

The Stanislaus County Resource Recovery Facility began commercial operation in January 1989, serving the City of Modesto and Stanislaus County. The facility processes 800 tons of solid waste per day, which generates up to 22.5 megawatts of renewable energy that is sold to Pacific Gas and Electric Company. This is equivalent to an estimated electrical consumption of 20,000 homes. The Facility also performs ferrous metal recovery and recycles approximately 5,000 tons of metal annually.

The Facility is equipped with several pollution control technologies to keep the emissions to a minimum, and since its start-up in 1989 the Facility's environmental performance has exceeded expectations. The addition of mercury control systems in 2000, as required by EPA's Clean Air Act, further improved the Facility's air control standards to levels far better than the permitted limits. The Facility is also a zero water discharge plant, which means that all wastewater generated on-site is treated and reused in the process.

As of January 2018, the Facility has processed 7.8 million tons of solid waste and generated 3.9 billion kilowatt hours of energy. A portion of this energy is used to operate the facility and the remaining amount goes to the grid. The Stanislaus County Resource Recovery Facility is located in Crows Landing, about 25 miles from Modesto. For additional information or to arrange a tour, please call 209-837-4423.

HOW IT WORKS:



- 1 Waste is delivered to the facility and stored in a bunker.
- 2 The waste is transferred to a combustion chamber where self-sustaining combustion is maintained at extremely high temperatures. We maintain the building around the tipping and bunker area under negative pressure and use this air in the combustion process to control odor.
- 3 The heat from the combustion process boils water.
- 4 & 5 The steam from the boiling water is used directly or more frequently, the steam drives a turbine that generates electricity.
- 6 Electricity is distributed to the local grid.
- 7 Ash from combustion is processed to extract metal for recycling. It is then combined with residue from the air pollution control process (see items 9 and 10).
- 8 The combined ash is either disposed of in a monofill that receives only that waste, used as cover material at a conventional landfill, or landfilled with other waste.
- 9 All gases are collected, filtered, and cleaned before being emitted into the atmosphere. We manage gas from the combustion process with state-of-the-art air pollution control technology that operates to state and federal standards.
- 10 We control emissions of particulate matter primarily through a baghouse (fabric filter).
- 11 We monitor criteria and other pollutants and operating parameters to ensure compliance with permit conditions.

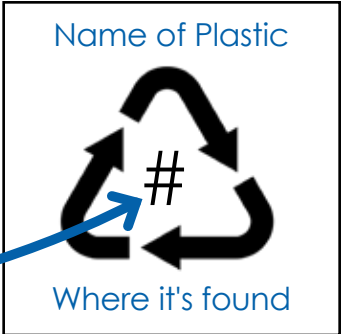
RESIN IDENTIFICATION CODES

RESIN CODES

DO YOU KNOW WHAT THE SYMBOLS MEAN?

The small numbers on the bottom of your plastic bottles and takeout containers are Resin Identification Codes. They can be used to determine which plastics can be recycled in accordance with local recycling mandates.

Each number identifies which type of plastic is present in a container or bottle.



PET (Polyethylene Terephthalate)

Pouring used motor oil down a storm drain is just plain yucky! It dirties our rivers, streams and water supply.

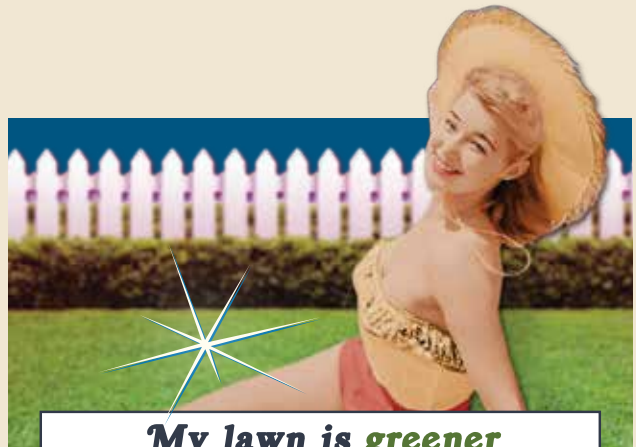
Recycle your used oil and fix those nasty leaks.
