Noon Speaker

Carol Shipley, Stanislaus County Assistant District Attorney - The Stanislaus County Family Justice Center

This presentation is about a Center which would provide "one-stop services" for victims of Domestic Violence, Elder Abuse, Sexual Assault and Child Abuse. The Center would be a place where a multi-disciplinary team of professionals are housed under one roof and would reduce the amount of times and places victims would have to go to tell their story and get the help they need from one location. The Center is in the early planning stages at this point.

David Love, MFT – Effective Prevention Strategies

This presentation will discuss the impact of domestic violence on children and families and how to identify and assist these families. Specific intervention strategies will be outlined and discussed.

- Participants will be able to discuss two intervention strategies to help promote safe and stable families.
