## New Gallo Center for the Arts is being tuned by world-renowned acoustic genius

Stanislaus County, CA – Christopher Jaffe has worked on some of the most prestigious arts centers in the world - venues like the John F. Kennedy Center Concert Hall in Washington, D.C., the Judy Zankel Hall at the Carnegie Hall in New York City, the Hollywood Bowl and more than 250 concert halls, opera houses, theatres and music pavilions on five continents. He has worked with architects such as I.M. Pei, Frank Gehry and Michael Graves.

On **Thursday, August 30, 2007,** Jaffe will be acoustically tuning the new Gallo Center for the Arts as it prepares for its grand opening.

Jaffe used psycho-acoustic research to develop electronic reflected energy systems, simulating specific bits of reflective energy critical to the perceptions of presence, definition, and warmth. He'll tell you what that really means.
