### **iPhone device training at the Modesto Library**

*Individuals struggling to hear or see their iPhones can learn strategies to make their phones work better for them*

A “Bring Your Own Device” iPhone training will be held at the Modesto Library on Monday, Aug. 20 from 1 to 3 p.m. A representative from the California Telephone Access Program (CTAP) will offer help to participants who have difficulties seeing and hearing their iPhones.

The training will teach participants about the basic functions of the iPhone, as well as offer instruction on text messaging, the magnifier function, Bluetooth and more. The program is designed to give participants hands-on experience practicing their new skills on their own devices.

“Smartphones allow users to stay connected to their loved ones and to the world around them. Users will have the opportunity to learn more about their smartphones in a low-stress, no-pressure environment,” said Vicki Salinas, reference librarian.
