On Saturday, April 20th from 11a.m. to 2p.m., the regional park will host three huge Easter egg hunts and an array of other free games and activities.

All children are welcome to have their portraits taken with the Easter Bunny himself starting at 11 a.m., and photos will be available for free on Modesto Reservoir's Facebook page. Other attractions include face painting, balloon animals, train rides, and many more activities. The first 100 children to arrive at the event will receive a free goodie bag of treats. Kat Country will be broadcasting live at the event with upbeat music and lively DJs. Food vendors will also be present, serving hot dogs, tacos, and other kid-friendly fare.

Each hunt will have special eggs containing golden tickets hidden throughout. Whoever finds these special eggs will be win an Easter Basket filled with prizes.

But the real prize for families is a trip to scenic Modesto Reservoir, and a chance to spend some quality family time out of the house.

"The venue here at Modesto Reservoir spotlights some unbelievable natural resources, just a short distance from home," Aggers said. "This Easter Egg Hunt is such a great opportunity for your family to experience of all this beauty, showing them a local attraction they can experience any day of the week."
