B. REZONE APPLICATION NO. 2003-13 - MILLEFIORE LANDSCAPE MATERIALS

- Request to rezone 3.56 acres from A-2-40 (General Agriculture) to a PD (Planned Development) to operate a landscape material business which includes recycling wood-chips, bark colorizing, bulk storage, landscape material sales, and a concrete batch plant. The typical hours of operation will be 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., seven days a week, with a maximum of eight (8) employees per shift. This is a two-phase project. Phase I: - all on-site improvements, except stationary concrete mixer, to be completed by January 1, 2006, and Phase II - the implementation of the stationary mixer to be completed by January 1, 2008. The property is located on the west side of Highway 99, south of the East Keyes Road Overpass and at the north end of Taylor Court, in the Keyes area. A Mitigated Negative Declaration will be considered.

THE APPLICANT, OR SUBSEQUENT PROPERTY OWNER, SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING LANDSCAPE PLANTS IN A HEALTHY AND ATTRACTIVE CONDITION. DEAD OR DYING PLANTS SHALL BE REPLACED WITH MATERIALS OF EQUAL SIZE AND SIMILAR VARIETY.
- C. ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT NO. 2004-01 PRODUCE STANDS/ MARKETS & SEASONAL ACTIVITIES - Proposed amendment to Chapters 21.90 -Produce Stands and Produce Markets, 21.20 - A-2 (General Agriculture), and Chapter 21.100 Staff Approval Permits, of the Stanislaus County Zoning Ordinance to address produce stands/markets and seasonal activities. This project is Exempt from CEQA.

- C. The Board approved a lot line adjustment and re-issuance of Williamson Act contracts on the west side of Modesto.
- D. The Board adopted the Redevelopment budget for Fiscal Year 2004-05 in the amount of \$2.1 million.
- E. The Board denied an appeal of the Planning Commission's decision to approve the East Oakdale Residential projects. These included the Hillsborough Estates II, Lands of Schutz, and Kushar Parcel Map.
