County Code. The proposed ordinance amendments apply to commercial cannabis activities in unincorporated Stanislaus County and include the following: minor technical amendments for the purposes of clarity and consistency with state regulations; minor amendments to the operating procedures of retail and cultivation activities; an amendment to the definitions of cultivation and youth center; updates to the procedural processes for the suspension, revocation, or non-renewal of Commercial Cannabis Activity Permits; updates to the procedural processes for the enforcement, declarations of public nuisance, and abatement procedures of commercial cannabis activities. All commercial cannabis projects will continue to be subject to obtaining a discretionary land use permit and development agreement prior to obtaining a Stanislaus County Commercial Cannabis Activity Permit. This project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. APN: County-wide
